

Dr. Amy C. Edmondson is the Novartis Professor of Leadership and Management at the Harvard Business School, a chair established to support the study of human interactions that lead to creation of successful enterprises that contribute to the betterment of society. She teaches and writes about leadership, teams and organizational learning. Before her academic career, she was Director of Research at Pecos River Learning Centers, where she worked on the design and implementation of transformational change in large companies. Edmondson received her PhD in

organizational behavior, AM in psychology, and AB in engineering and design, all from Harvard University.

Dr. Barbara Brandt is the founding Director of the National Center for Interprofessional Practice and Education and currently

Dr. Neil Harvison is the Chief Officer for Academic and Scientific Affairs at the American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA). Dr. Harvison has been a practitioner and hospital administrator in New York for over 20 years. While in New York, Dr. Harvison managed clinical faculty appointments at the Mount Sinai School of Medicine; Columbia University and Mercy College. Before joining as the Chief Officer, Dr. Harvison had been an active volunteer in AOTA while also participating on the ACOTE council and as chair of the doctoral standards committee. Dr. Harvison received the AOTA Fellows Awards in 2011 for service of education and practice.

Ivy Oandasan is the Director of Education at the College of Family Physicians of Canada and has been involved in many projects that have influenced innovative changes in health professions education in Canada. Recently, Dr. Oandasan supported the creation of a Rural Road Map for Action to influence recruitment and retention of family physicians using a social accountability approach. In addition to her involvement with CFPA, Dr. Oandasan is a professor at University of Toronto, Department of Family and Community Medicine and is an active physician. She spends her research efforts in the areas of competency-based family medicine and interprofessional education.



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
